<p>CHAINS 40.00</p>	<p>I make diligent search for the <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor. but can find no trace of it.</p>
<p>80.10</p>	<p>Intersect E and W line, 3.77 chs. E of the cor. of secs. 22, 23, 26 and 27.</p> <p>The true bearing of this line is therefore N.2*42'W., and the distance if 80.18 chs.</p> <p>I resurvey the line bet. secs. 26 and 27 as follows: From the cor. of secs. 22, 23, 26 and 27 Thence I run S.2*42'E on a true line bet. secs. 26 and 27. Ascend steep through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.</p>
<p>38.05</p>	<p>Coos trail on summit of divide, 400 ft. above sec. cor. bears E and W.</p>
<p>40.09</p>	<p>Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor. marked <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S 27 on W and 26 on E face, from which</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.65'E., 9 lks. dist., marked <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S 26 B T.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.65'W., 34 lks. dist., marked <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S 27 B T.</p> <p>I again make a careful search but can find no evidence of the old <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor.</p> <p>Descend from <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor. along spur.</p>
<p>76.60</p>	<p>Creek, 6 lks. wide, course East, 400 ft. below <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor. and ascend 75 ft.</p>
<p>80.18</p>	<p>The cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35.</p> <p>Land, mountainous.</p> <p>Soil, 3rd rate.</p> <p>Timber, fir and hemlock.</p> <p>Undergrowth, small fir, hemlock and vine maple.</p> <p>Land, mountainous. heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth, 80.18 chs.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">May 21, 1906.</p>
