

Resurvey of the line of secs. 11 and 12, T. 23 S., R. 10 W.

CHAINS

Soil, stony, 3rd rate.

Timber fir.

Undergrowth, salal, vine maple and thimbleberry.

Land, mountainous or covered with dense undergrowth,

67.94 chs.

Resurvey of the line bet. secs. 1 and 2, T. 23 S., R. 10 W.

In order to establish the closings of boundaries of sec.

2; I begin at the meander cor. of frac. secs. 1 and 2 on

the NE shore of Loon Lake, which is an ash tree, 7 ins.

diam. The blazes are much defaced by action of waves.

It was blazed on South, East and West faces; the follow-

ing marks are legible: S 1 on E., S 2 on W.

From this tree,

An ash, 8 ins. diam., bears N.5°W., 8 lks. dist.,

marked S 2 B T.

I mark cor. tree M C on S., T 23 S on N., R 10 W S 1 on E.,

and S 2 on W., from which I mark a new tree.

An ash, 11 ins. diam., bears S.34°E., 46 lks. dist.,

marked T 23 S R 10 W M C B T.

This cor. tree was 4 ins. diam., when marked, and is evid-

ently the true meander cor., but I could find no trees

corresponding with those described by the Surveyor

General.

At the M. C. of frac. secs. 1 and 12.

A flag previously set on W shore of the Lake, at meander

cor. of frac. secs. 2 and 11, bears S.27°18'W.

A flag, previously set on the S shore of Lake, at meander

cor. of frac. secs. 11 and 12, bears S.0°32'E.

Angle bet. cors. 24°33'.
