

Resurvey of the line bet. secs. 1 and 2, T. 23 S., R. 10 W.

CHAINS

Ascend steep hill.

60.00 Summit of divide, 800 ft. above Mill Creek, bears NW and SE.

73.74 $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor. post gone.

Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor. on W bdy. of sec. 1, marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S on W., and 1 on E. face, from which

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.33*E., 56 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T. (Old B. T.)

As marks are nearly illegible, I mark same $\frac{1}{2}$ S 1 B T.

As the tree in sec. 2 is gone, I mark a new tree as follows:

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.36*W., 86 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.

84.06 Meander cor. on North shore of Loon Lake.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 3rd rate.

Timber, fir and hemlock.

Undergrowth, salal, vine maple and thimbleberry.

Land, mountainous or covered with dense undergrowth,
