	Note cloudy at noon; sun invisible on the meridian Mountainous land or covered with dense undergrowth, 79.65 chs.
	North, 0*1'W., bet. secs. 25 and 26 Ascend
.50	Top of spur, about 10 ft. above sec. cor., sloping W Begin descent
17.25	Creek, 10 lks. wide, course W., about 50 ft. below top of spur. Ascend
19.00	Top of spur, sloping W about 50 ft. above last creek. Begin descent
20.00	Enter bottom land about 35 ft. below top of spur
24.00	McKinley Creek 40 lks. wide, course S.20*W
23.00 ?	Leave bottom land and ascend along hillside, sloping E
40.00	Set a basalt stone, 12x8x8 ins., 8 ins. in the ground, for ¼ sec. cor. marked ¼ on W face, from which A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears East 9 lks. dist. Marked ¼ S B T A cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears N.30*W., 26 lks. dist. Marked ¼ S B T This cor. is about 40 ft. above McKinley Creek bottom Va. 19*E

78.25	Top of spur, sloping S., about 75 ft. above ¼ sec. cor. Ascend along W slope of this spur
80.00	Set a fir post, 4 ft. long; 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 24, 25, 26, and 23, marked T 24 S S 24 on NE, R 1 W S 25 on SE, S 26 on SW and S 23 on NW faces, with 2 notches on the S, and 1 notch on E edges, from which
