

Subdivisions of T 24 S., R. 1 W.

CHAINS	
24.00	Top of spur sloping S about 75 ft. above McKinley Creek Descend
37.90	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S.20*E., about 50 ft. below spur, last noted Ascend
39.87½	Set a hemlock post, 4 ft. long 4 ins. sq. for ¼ sec. cor. 24 ins. in the ground, marked ¼ S on N face, from which A fir, 34 ins. diam., bears N.64*W., 19 lks. dist. Marked ¼ S B T A fir, 26 ins. diam., bears S.73*E., 23 lks. dist. Marked ¼ S B T This cor. is on a steep hillside, sloping E., about 25 ft. above creek
43.50	Top of spur, sloping SE about 50 ft. above ¼ sec. cor. Begin descent
51.04	Dry bed of creek, course SE about 100 ft. below top of spur Ascend
70.76	Top of ridge, bears N and S about 300 ft. above dry creek bed. Descend
79.75	To cor. of secs. 1, 12, 11, and 2, about 50 ft. below ridge Land, mountainous Soil, 3rd and 4th rate Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, chincapin, madrona, and maple Dense undergrowth of rhododendron, chincapin, hemlock, fir, vine-maple, huckleberry, and salal-berry. Mountainous land, or covered with dense undergrowth, 79.75 chs.
