	Land, mountainous
	Soil, 3rd and 4th rates
	Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, chincapin, cherry, yew, madrona, and alder
	Dense undergrowth of rhododendron, mountain-balm, vine-maple, chincapin, hemlock, fir, cedar, pine, huckleberry and salal-berry
