24.02	Spur sloping N, about 40 ft. above last creek
	Begin descent
27.90	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N.10*E., about 25 ft. below last spur. Begin ascent
30.77	Top of spur, sloping N, about 25 ft. above creek, last noted, Begin descent
39.58	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N, about 50 ft. below last spur. Begin ascent
39.89	Set a basalt stone, 16x10x10 ins. 11 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N face, from which A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N.27*E., 8 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.27*E., 21 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T This cor. is on a steep hillside, sloping E. 25 ft. above last creek Mag. decl. 19*E

56.26	Top of ridge, bears N and S about 150 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. Mag. decl. 19*E
63.03	A fir tree, on line, I mark with 2 notches on E and W sides Tree 12 ins. diam.
71.75	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course NW, about 200 ft. below ridge, Begin ascent.
76.00	Mag. decl. 20*30'E
79.78	To cor. of secs. 22, 27, 28, and 21, about 50 ft. above creek Land, mountainous Soil, 3rd and 4th rates Timbered with fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, chincapin, maple, madrona, alder, and dogwood Dense undergrowth of rhododendron, vine-maple, chincapin, hemlock, fir, mountain-balm, huckleberry and salal-berry
