67.40	Spur, sloping S., about 75 ft. above dry creek bed. Begin descent
76.55	Spur, sloping S about 75 ft. below last spur
80.25	To cor. of secs. 15, 22, 21, and 16, about 25 ft. below last spur Land, mountainous Soil, 3rd and 4th rates Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, chincapin, maple, and madrona Dense undergrowth of vine-maple, rhododendron, hemlock, fir, cedar, chincapin, huckleberry and salal-berry Mountainous land, and covered with dense undergrowth 80.25 chs. Aug. 8, 1896
	North, 0°2'W., bet. secs. 15 & 16
	Ascend
17.50	Top of ridge, bears E and W about 150 ft. above sec. cor. Begin descent
33.75	Dry bed of creek, course NE, about 50 ft. below ridge
40.00	Falls on a boulder, 3x3x2 ft. above ground. At exact point for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on E side. I mark a cross and $\frac{1}{4}$ from which A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.38°E., 32 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.67°W., 9 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T
61.75	This cor. is about 25 ft. below dry bed of creek Spur sloping E about 175 ft. below $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. Continue descent
71.30	Creek, 20 lks. wide, course SE about 125 ft. below spur last noted
