	Ascend
12.80	Spur, sloping NE about 100 ft. above sec. cor.
20.34	Top of ridge, bears SE and NW about 200 ft. above sec. cor. Descend
40.17	Set a basalt stone, 16x12x10 ins. 12 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N face, from which A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S.70*E., 11 lk. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N.27*W., 34 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T This cor. is on a steep hillside, sloping W, about 200 ft. below ridge
42.25	Dry bed of creek, course S.15*W., about 25 ft. below $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. Begin ascent
55.30	Top of spur, sloping S, about 25 ft. above dry creek bed Begin descent
64.15	Creek, 3 lks. wide, course S., about 75 ft. below spur last noted. Ascend
68.05	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SE about 50 ft. above last creek.
73.15	Top of spur, sloping S.80*E., about 75 ft. above last creek. Descend
80.34	To cor. secs. 4, 9, 8, and 5, about 25 ft. below spur, last noted. Land, mountainous Soil, 3rd and 4th rates Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, yew, and chincapin Dense undergrowth of rhododendron, vine-maple, chincapin, mountain-balm, hemlock, fir, huckleberry and salal-berry Mountainous land and covered with dense undergrowth 80.34 chs.
