2.00	Mag. decl. 18*E
4.00	Mag. decl. 20*E
11.50	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N.75*W about 100 ft. below sec. cor. Ascend
15.00	Top of spur, sloping NW about 50 ft. above creek
39.94½	Set a hemlock post, 4 ft. 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground for ¼ sec. cor. marked ¼ S on N face, from which A hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears S.22*E., 38 lks. dist. Marked ¼ S B T A cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 3 lks. dist. Marked ¼ S B T This cor. is on a hillside, sloping E about 50 ft. above last spur
