113.75	Top of spur, sloping N about 200 ft. above last creek Begin descent
144.03	Creek, 6 lks. wide, course N about 400 ft. below spur last noted Ascend
147.32	Intersect E bdy. of T. 24 S., R. 2 W., 11.58 chs. S.9*19'W of cor. of secs. 36 and 25, which I reestablished July 21, 1896. ^A At this point of intersection, I set a cedar post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of secs. 30 and 31 marked C C T 24 S R 1 W on E., S 30 on N and, S 31 on S faces, with 5 grooves on N and 1 groove on S faces, from which A chincapin, 10 ins. diam., bears N.67*E., 47 lks. dist. Marked T 24 S R 1 W S 30 B T A hemlock, 6 ins. diam., bears S.43*E., 21 lks. dist. Marked T 24 S R 1 W S 31 B T This cor. is on a steep hillside, sloping N about 50 ft. above creek Land, mountainous Soil, 3rd and 4th rates Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, chincapin, madrona, yew, maple, and alder Dense undergrowth of rhododendron, hemlock, fir, vine- maple, mountain-balm, huckleberry and salal-berry Mountainous land and covered with dense undergrowth 147.32 chs.
