40.00	Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
79.50	Intersect the East boundary of the Tp. 26 lks. S. of cor. to secs. 25, 30, 31 & 36, which is a post 4 ft. long and 4 ins. sq., firmly set in the ground, marked T 24 S S 30 on NE., R 1 W S 31 on SE., R 2 W S 36 on SW. and S 25 on NW. faces with 5 notches on N. and 1 notch on S. edges, from which <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A cedar, 24 ins. diam., bears N.41*E. 52 lks. dist. marked T 24 S R 1 W S 30 B T. A cedar, 42 ins. diam., bears S.75*E. 15 lks. dist. marked T 24 S R 1 W S 31 B T. A hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears S.25*W. 15 lks. dist. marked T 24 S R 2 W S 36 B T. A hemlock, 14 ins. diam., bears N.20*W. 33 lks. dist. marked T 24 S R 2 W S 25 B T. <p>Thence I run N.89*59'W. on a true line bet. Secs. 25 & 36.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Var. 20*E.</p>
15.00	Through timber and ascend about 300 ft. to Ridge, NE. & SW. and descend about 600 ft.
39.75	Set a post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on N. face, from which <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A laurel, 6 ins. diam., bears S.70*E. 19 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A laurel, 7 ins. diam., bears N.19*W. 10 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
79.50	The cor. to secs. 25, 26, 35 & 36. Land, mountainous and heavily timbered with fir & hemlock. With dense undergrowth of rhododendron and hemlock, 79.50 chs. Soil, sandy & rocky, 3rd and 4th rate.
