General Description

This Township is high, rough & mountainous, densely covered with forests & thick undergrowth.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, laurel, chinquapin, yew and dogwood.

Thick undergrowth of sallal, fir, vine maple, hazel, salmonberry, manzanita, laurel, huckleberry, thimbleberry & mountain balm.

West Boundary of T. 24 S., R. 3 W.

From the corner to Secs. 25 & 30, 31 & 36, Township 24 S., Ranges 3 & 4 West, which is a post 4 ins. sq. firmly set in the ground marked T 24 S S 30 on NE., R 3 W S 31 on SE., R 4 W S 36 on SW., and S 25 on NW. faces, with 5 notches on N. and 1 notch on S. edges from which
