80.22	The cor. to secs. 11, 12, 13 & 14. Land, mountainous. Soil, 3rd rate. Densely covered with forest of red, yellow & white fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, laurel chinquapin, yew & chittim. Thick undergrowth of sallal, vine maple, hazel, fir, man- zanita, thimble, huckle, salmon & elder berry & arrow wood.
