| 55.82 | A fir, 40 ins. diam. | |
| 61.20 | A fir, 50 ins. diam. | |
| 80.32 | Intersect the N. & S. line 47 lks. S. of cor. to secs. 27, 28, 33 & 34. Thence I run S.89*40*W. on true line between Secs. 28 & 33, with same var. | |
| 40.16 | Set hemlock post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on N. face, from which A hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears N.5*E. 11 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A hemlock, 24 ins. diam., bears S.15*W. 18 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. | |
| 80.32 | The cor. to secs. 28, 29, 32 & 33. Land, mountainous. Soil, 2nd rate. Densely covered with forest of red, white & yellow fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, laurel, chinquapin, yew & chittim very fine quality. Thick undergrowth of sallal, vine maple, hazel, fir, manzanita, thimble, huckle, salmon & elder berry & arrow wood. | |
| | From the cor. to secs. 16 & 17, 20 & 21, which is a post firmly set in the ground marked T 24 S S 16 on NE., R 3 W S 21 on SE., S 20 on SW., and S 17 on NW. faces, with 3 notches on S. and 4 notches on E. edges, from which An alder, 10 ins. diam., bears N.70*E. 56 lks. dist. marked T 24 S R 3 W S 16 B T. | |
