CHAINS

Land, mountainous and densely covered with forest.  
Soil, 3rd rate.  
Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, maple, alder & yew.  
Thick undergrowth of sallow, vine maple, hazel, fir,  
manzanita, elder, salmon & thimble berry.

General Description

This township is rough & mountainous throughout. It is well watered by the Callapooia and its branches. There is an abundance of timber, valuable for commercial purposes.  
The quality of the soil along the creeks is 1st rate but the extent of the bottom is too limited to subserve agricultural purpose. The hills are generally 3rd rate, suitable only for grazing.  
The principal kinds of timber are red, yellow & white fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, laurel, chinquapin, yew & chittim.  
There is a thick undergrowth consisting of sallow, vine maple, hazel, fir, manzanita, thimbleberry, huckleberry, salmonberry, elderberry & arrow wood.  
There are several settlers in the township along the Callapooia Creek, but none on the land embraced in the survey.
