This line runs along the south slope of Balo mountain 1000 feet high--There is no land North of this line fit for cultivation--So we concluded it unnecessary to continue the survey from the North.

Sanburn's house stands in a small valley bearing into the canyon & on the pack trail from Scottsburg to Winchester.

There may be 20 or 30 acres of land West of his house fit for cultivation. The balance on the West all rugged fir mountains & entirely unfit for settlement.

General Description

This Township, except in Green Valley in the SE cor. of the Township, is hilly principally oak openings & mountains timbered with fir, laurel & etc.

With a thick undergrowth of vine-maple, hazel, willow, ninebark, briar, fern, poison oak & etc.

The soil in oak hills, generally 2nd rate producing good grasses & will grow good wheat & oats. The mountains are generally 2nd & 3rd rate, but too rugged for settlement. Green Valley & some of the smaller valleys on streams are 1st rate. Clay loam & alluvial, we had to subdivide considerable mountain region to reach parts inhabitable.
