	West on N boundary , sec. 4. Va. 20*35'E.
	Descend.
10.60	A stream, 3 lks. wide, course N.30*W., a point 400 ft. below sec. cor. and ascend.
17.70	Top of a spur, course N., 200 ft. high and descend.
26.10	A stream, 3 lks. wide, course N., about 150 ft. below top of spur and ascend gradually.
31.70	Top of a ridge, course N.20*W.
40.00	Set a post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N face from which A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.37*E., 24 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears 567*E., 24 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
50.65	A stream, 3 lks. wide, course N.60*W.
64.85	A stream, 5 lks. wide, course N.15*W., a point about 400 ft. below $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. and ascend.
76.86	A Point about 200 ft. above stream. The cor. to secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33. Land mountainous, 7686 chs. Soil 3rd and 4th rate. Heavily timbered with fir, cedar, maple and laurel, with dense undergrowth of hazel, arrowwood, vinemaple, sallel, briars, 7686 chs. Oct. 28, 1893.
	In subdividing this township, I was unable to close within limits around sec. 18 and found it necessary to re-survey the east boundary of section 13, T 24 S R 8 W. Beginning at the cor. to secs. 13 and 24, on east boundary of T 24 S R 8 W., which is a post, 5 ins. sq., marked T 24 S S 18 on NE., R 7 W S 19 on SE., R 8 W S 24 on SW., and S 13 on NW faces with 3 notches on N and S edges, from which
