

Subdivisions of T 24 S. R 7 W. W.M.

CHAINS

From the closing cor. to secs. 22 and 23, I run  
S.0\*2'E., on a true line bet. secs. 22 and 23.

Ve. 20\*30'E.

Ascend abruptly;

15.00 Top of ascend; a point about 650 ft. above closing cor.

Thence along W slope to

28.39 A Fir, 16 ins. diam., marked with 2 notches on N and S  
sides, and descend.

39.84 Set a post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground  
for  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor., marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S on W. face, from which

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.53\*E., 7 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.

A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.60\*W., 11 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.

49.99 A Fir, 24 ins. diam., marked with 2 notches on N and S  
sides.

56.40 A stream, 1 lk. wide, course S.W.

56.55 A stream, 2 lks. wide, course W.

58.85 A Stream, 2 lks. wide, course NW.

A point about 650 ft. below top of mountain and ascend.

79.84 A point about 500 ft. above last stream. The cor. to secs.  
22, 23, 26 and 27.

Land 79.84 chs., mountainous.

Soil 3rd and 4th rate.

Heavily timbered with fir, cedar and maple, with an under-  
growth of hazel, thimbleberry and briars, 79.84 chs.

Nov. 6, 1893.

At the witness cor. bet. secs. 14 and 15, which is 60 chs.

N of cor. to secs. 14, 15, 22 and 23, I find remains  
of old post, from which

A Laurel stump, 14 ins. diam., bears S.60\*E., 8 lks.  
dist.,

A Fir stump, 16 ins. diam., bears N.45\*W., 25 lks.  
dist.
