

Subdivisions of T 24 S., R 7 W., W.M.

CHAINS

The mark on same, and old post, being obliterated, I destroy all trace of old cor. and re-establish it as follows:

Set a post, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground marked W C on N., R 7 W S 14 on E., T 24 on S., and S 15 on W faces, from which

A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.51*E., 29 lks. dist., marked T 24 S R 7 W S 14 W C B T.

A Fir, 50 ins. diam., bears N.79*W., 83 lks. dist., marked T 24 S R 7 W S 15 B T.

The meander cor. on the left bank of the Umpqua River bears South, 2.27 chs. dist.

Thence I run

N.0*2'W., bet. secs. 14 and 15.

Va. 20*35'E.

Ascend to

20.00 A point about 750 ft. above witness cor. This point falling on a flat rock in place, I mark a cross (+) at exact cor. point for cor. to secs. 10, 11, 14, and 15, with 4 notches on S and 2 notches E., edges.

From cor. point.

A W Oak, 7 ins. diam., bears N.75*E., 50 lks. dist., marked T 24 S R 7 W S 11 B T.

A W Oak, 14 ins. diam., bears S.79*E., 28 lks. dist., marked T 24 S R 7 W S 14 B T.

A W Oak, 11 ins. diam., bears S.43*W., 19 lks. dist., marked T 24 S R 7 W S 15 B T.

No tree in limits in sec. 10.

A cross chiseled on a perpendicular rock marked S 10 bears N.68*W., 15 lks. dist.

Land mountainous, 20 chs.

Soil 4th rate, rocky.

Heavily timbered with cedar, fir, oak and laurel, with a dense undergrowth of myrtle, hazel and briars, 20.00 chs.
