

Subdivisions of T 24 S., R 7 W., W.M.

CHAINS

Va. 20°35'E.

Ascend.

12.00 Top of a spur, course N.60°E., about 150 ft. high and descend.

17.95 A stream, 5 lks. wide, course N.30°E.

41.48 Set a post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W. face, from which

A Cedar, 18 ins. diam., bears N.64°W., 102 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A Yew, 9 ins. diam., bears N.80°E., 91 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

60.50 Summit of mountain, course E and W about 100 ft. high and descend.

81.48 The cor. to secs. 10, 11, 14, and 15.

Land mountainous, 81.48 chs.

Soil 3rd and 4th rate.

Heavily timbered with fir, cedar and yew, with a dense undergrowth of hazel, arrowwood and briars, 81.48 chs.

Nov. 9, 1893.

I now return to the witness cor. bet. secs. 33 and 34, which is 60.00 chs. South of cor. to secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34, and which is a post, 4 ins. sq., marked T 24 S R 7 W on N., S 34 on E., W C on S., S 33 on W., faces, from which

A Fir, 60 ins. diam., bears N.65°W., 47 lks. dist., marked T 24 S R 7 W S 33 WC B T.

A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.6°E., 42 lks. dist., marked T 24 S R 7 W S 34 WC B T.

Thence I run

S.0°2'E., on a true line bet. secs. 33 and 34.

Va. 20°35'E.
