CHAINS	October 28, 1896.
	East, bet. secs. 1 and 36.
	Va. 20° 35' E.
	Ascend from cor.
12.00	Leave old burn and enter green timber.
19.75	A stream, 2 lks. wide, course NW.
39.43	Qr. sec. cor. which is a fir post firmly set in the ground, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor general.
45.00	Summit of ridge bears NE and SW, 150 ft. above the stream; thence descend.
49.50	Small branch, course SW. 100 ft. below ridge; ascend.
79.80	Intersect E. bdy. of the Tp. 6 lks. S. of Whipples cor. and 1.94 chs. N. of old Tp. cor. Both corners are marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.
