GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

This Township contains but little or no lands valuable for agriculture, excepting a narrow bottom along the small creek in Secs. 35 and 36. The canyons and mountain benches contain much fine timber, chiefly fir but too remote from transportation to be valuable. Many of the hills are covered with grape and peavine and affords an excellent range for stock.
