	Ascend about 75 ft. to
60.00	Top of ridge, course NE.
	Descend about 100 ft. to
70.00	A Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, flows NE.
	Ascend about 100 ft. to
80.48	The cor. to Secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36.
	Land, broken. 70.48 chs.

I now go to the cor. to Secs. 23, 24, 25 and 26, which I find nearly obliterated, only the stump of the NE tree is left standing with indistinct marks. I destroy all trace of the old cor. and re-establish same as follows:

Set a post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. to Secs. 23, 24, 25 and 26, marked T 24 S S 24 on NE., R 8 W S 25 on SE., S 26 on SW and S 23 on NW faces, with 2 notches on South and 1 notch on East edges, from which

A Fir, 48 ins. diam., bears N.35*E., 49 lks. dist., marked T 24 S R 8 W S 24 - B T.

A Fir, 48 ins. diam., bears S.45*E., 40 lks. dist., marked T 24 S R 8 W S 25 - B T.

A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.6*W., 54 lks.
