CHAINS	Heavily timbered with Fir and Hemlock. 80.00 chs. Dense undergrowth of rhododendron, laurel and salal. 80.00 chs.
	N.89*32'E. on a random line bet. Secs. 1 and 12. Va. 20*E.
79.60	Intersect the East bdy. of Tp., 15 lks. North of the cor. to Secs. 1, 6, 7, and 12. Thence I run S.89*38'W., on a true line bet. Secs. 1 and 12. Va. 20*E.
0.50	Ascend through heavy timber and dense undergrowth. A Fir, 30 ins. diam., on line marked with 2 notches on E. and W. sides.
10.25	Trail to Kellogg, course NE and SW.
18.00	Top of spur, course NE. about 150 ft. above sec. cor. Descend about 150 ft. to
36.00	A Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, flows SW. Ascend.
39.80	Set a post $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N face, from which A Fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N.32*W., 14 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.4*E., 55 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
62.00	Top of spur, course SW. about 150 ft. above spring branch. Descend about 175 ft. to
79.60	The cor. to Secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12. Land, mountainous, 79.60 chs. Soil, sandy and rocky, 3rd and 4th rate. Heavily timbered with Hemlock, Fir and scattering
