CHAINS

post 4 in. sq., 2 ft. above and firmly set in the ground, marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S on N. face, from which

A Maple, 12 ins. diam., bears N.70*W., 30 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.

A Cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears S.40*E., 58 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.

Thence I run

S.89*24'W., on a true line bet. Secs. 26 and 35.

Va. 20*E.

Creek bottom.

1.50 A Creek, 30 lks. wide, flows NE.

Thence in creek.

7.50 Leave Creek to South of line.

16.00 Same Creek, course SE.

Leave bottom, course N. and S.

Ascend about 100 ft. to

22.00 Top of spur, sloping N.

Descend about 125 ft. to

31.50 A Creek, 10 lks. wide, flows NE.

Ascend about 70 ft. to

38.50 Top of ridge, course N. and S.
