- 40.00 Set a post $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S on W face, from which
- A Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N.85°E., 53 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.
- A Chinquapin, 10 ins. diam., bears N.62°W., 23 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.
- 57.50 Top of spur, course NE., about 250 ft. above last spring branch.
- Descend about 200 ft. to
- 75.00 A Creek, 20 lks, wide, flows SE.
- Ascend about 70 ft. to
- 80.00 Set a post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. to Secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15, marked T 24 S S 11 on NE., R 8 W S 14 on SE., S 15 on SW., and S 10 on NE faces., with 4 notches on South and 2 notches on East edges, from which
- A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.48°E., 28 lks. dist., marked T 24 S R 8 W S 11 - B T.,
- A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.60°E., 28 lks. dist., marked T 24 S R 8 W S 14 - B T.
- A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.64°W., 37 lks. dist., marked T 24 S R 8 W S 15 - B T.
- A Fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N.71°W., 49 lks. dist., marked T 24 S R 8 W S 10 - B T.
- Land, mountainous. 80.00 chs.
- Soil, sandy and rocky, 3rd and 4th rate.
- Heavily timbered with Fir and Hemlock. 80.00 chs.
- Dense undergrowth of vinemaple, hazel and arrow-wood.
