A Fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N.73*W., 47 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.

46.25 A Creek, 6 lks. wide, flows SE. about 300 ft. below
sec. cor.

47.25 A Creek, 4 lks. wide, flows NE.
Ascend.

62.50 Enter Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, flows NW.

63.50 Leave same.

81.44 The cor. to Secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11, about 200 ft. above
last creek.

Land mountainous. 81.44 chs.

Soil, sandy and rocky, 3rd and 4th rate.

Heavily timbered with Fir and Hemlock. 81.44 chs.

Dense undergrowth of laurel, salmon-berry and
rhododendron. 81.44 chs.

From the cor. to Secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34. on the
South Boundary of the Tp., which is a post, 5 ins.
sq., firmly set in the ground, marked T 24 S S 34
on NE., R. 8 W S 3 on SE., T 25 S S 4 on SW., and
S33 on NW faces, with 3 notches on East and West
edges, from which

A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.32*E., 100 lks.
dist., marked T 24 S R 8 W S 34 - B T.

A Fir, 60 ins. diam., bears S89*E., 10 lks.
dist., marked T 25 S R 8 W S 3 - B T.

A Fir, 48 ins. diam., bears S.65*W., 34 lks.
dist., marked T 25 S R 8 W S 4 - B T.

A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.60*W., 48 lks.
dist., marked T 24 S R 8 W S 33 - B T.
