CHAINS

- 15.00 Top of spur, course SE.
Descend.
- 40.30 Set a post $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N face, from which
A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.25°E., 50 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
A Fir, 40 ins. diam., bears North, 27 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- 72.00 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, flows SE., about 150 ft. below top of spur.
Ascend about 50 ft. to
- 75.00 Top of ridge, course SE.
Descend about 50 ft. to
- 77.00 A Creek, 8 lks. wide, flows SE.
Ascend about 20 ft. to
- 78.00 Top of ridge, course SE.
Descend about 30 ft. to
- 80.60 The cor. to Secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10.
Land, mountainous. 80.60 chs.
Soil, sandy and rocky, 3rd and 4th rate.
Heavily timbered with Fir and Hemlock. 80.60 chs.
Dense undergrowth of laurel, hemlock and rhododendron.
80.60 chs.
