CHAINS

80.26 Intersect N. & S. line, 3 lks. South of the cor. to
 Secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16.
 Thence I run
 S.89°39'W., on a true line bet. Secs. 9 and 16.
Va. 20°E.
 Ascend through heavy timber and dense undergrowth about
 70 ft. to
 6.00 Top of spur, course NE.
 Descend about 200 ft. to
 32.75 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, flows SW.
 Ascend about 100 ft. to
 40.13 Top of spur, course SE.
 Set a post 3½ ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the
 ground for ¼ sec. cor., marked ¼ S. on N. face,
 from which
 A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.30°W., 50 lks. dist.,
 marked ¼ S B T.
 A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.35°W., 75 lks.
 dist., marked ¼ S B T.
 52.00 A Brook, 3 lks. wide, flows S. about 120 ft. below
 ¼ sec. cor.
 Ascend about 30 ft. to
 53.00 Top of ridge, course SE.
 Descend about 50 ft. to
 56.00 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, flows SE.
 Ascend about 200 ft. to
 72.00 Top of ridge, course NE.
 Descend about 150 ft. to
 80.26 The cor. to Secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17.
 Land, mountainous. 80.26 chs.
 Soil, sandy and rocky, 3rd and 4th rate.
 Heavily timbered with Fir and Hemlock. 80.26 chs.
 Dense undergrowth of small hemlock, vinemaple and
 salal. 80.26 chs.
