

Subdivisions of T. 24 S., R 8 W.

CHAINS

- Descend.
- 64.75 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, flows S.
- 65.40 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, flows SE., about 300 ft. below top of divide.
- Ascend about 250 ft. to
- 80.74 The cor. to Secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9.
- Land, mountainous. 80.75 chs.
- Soil, sandy and rocky, 3rd and 4th rate.
- Heavily timbered with Fir and Hemlock. 80.74 chs.
- Dense undergrowth of small hemlock, rhododendron and vinemaple. 80.74 chs.
- June 18th, 1894
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- N.0°3'E., on a random line bet. Secs. 4 and 5.
- Va. 20°E.
- 40.00 Set temporary $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor.
- 80.61 Intersect the North boundary of the Tp., 45 lks. East of the cor. to Secs. 4 and 5.
- Thence I run
- S.0°16'E., on a true line bet. Secs. 4 and 5.
- Va. 20°E.
- Ascend through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
- 20.30 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, flows NE.
- 40.61 Top of ridge, course E. & W., about 300 ft. above sec. cor.
- Set a post $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S. on W. face, from which
- A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.80°W., 16 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.
- A Fir, 22 ins. diam., bears S.88°E., 14 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.
- Descend.
- 52.75 Rocky glade, course E. and W.
