CHAINS

post, 4 ins. sq., firmly set in the ground, marked
T 24 S S 30 on NE., R. 8 W S 31 on SE., R 9 W S 36
on SW., and S 25 on NW faces, with 1 notch on South
and 5 notches on North edges, from which

A Cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears N.20°E., 19 lks.
dist., marked T 24 S R 8 W S 30 - B T.

A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.65°E., 22 lks.
dist., marked T 24 S R 8 W S 31 - B T.

A Hemlock, 40 ins. diam., bears S.15°W., 25 lks.
dist., marked T 24 S R 9 W S 36 - B T.

A Hemlock, 24 ins. diam., bears N.20°W., 32 lks.
dist., marked T 24 S R 9 W S 25 - B T.

Thence I run

S.89°43'E., on a true line bet. Secs. 30 and 31.

Va. 20°E.

Ascend through heavy timber and dense undergrowth
about 75 ft. to

3.70 Top of spur, course SW.

Descend about 150 ft. to

9.50 A Creek, 10 lks. wide, flows SW.

Ascend.

A Hemlock, 20 ins. diam., bears N.8°E., 18 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

61.70 The cor. to Secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32, about 350 ft.
above creek.

Land, mountainous. 61.70 chs.

Soil, sandy and rocky, 3rd and 4th rate.

Heavily timbered with Fir, Hemlock and scattering
Cedar. 61.70 chs.
