CHAINS

79.84 Intersect the N. & S. line, 15 lks. South of the cor.
to Secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9.
Thence I run
S.89°42'W., on a true line bet. Secs. 5 and 8.
Va. 20°E.
Ascend along slope of ridge through heavy timber and
dense undergrowth.

16.50 A Brook, 4 lks. wide, flows SE.

31.75 Top of ridge, course SW., about 250 ft. above sec. cor.
Descend.

39.92 Set a post 3½ ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the
ground for ¼ sec. cor., marked ¼ S. on N. face,
from which
A Fir, 48 ins. diam., bears N.47°E., 17 lks.
dist., marked ¼ S B T.
A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.38°W., 40 lks.
dist., marked ¼ S B T.

48.50 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, flows SW., about 250 ft.
below top of ridge.
Ascend about 40 ft. to

52.50 Top of spur, course SW.
Descend about 100 ft. to

65.60 A Creek, 8 lks. wide, flows SW.
Ascend about 30 ft. to

70.00 Top of spur, course S.
Descend about 30 ft. to

74.00 A Brook, 4 lks. wide, flows S.
Ascend about 75 ft. to

79.84 The cor. to Secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8.
Land, mountainous. 79.84 chs.
Soil, sandy and rocky, 3rd and 4th rate.
Heavily timbered with Fir and Hemlock. 79.84 chs.
Dense undergrowth of salal, rhododendron and small
hemlock. 79.84 chs.
