Retracement of South Boundary T. 24 S., R. 9 W.  
--- Same Debut & Contract. ---

CHAINS

At the corner of T. 24 S., Rs. 8 and 9 W.

Thence I run

West, on retracement of old blazed line, marking

S. bdy. Sec. 36, T. 24 S., R. 9 W.

9.15 Lake creek, 50 lks. wide, course N.

20.15 Ascend steep ridge, course NW.

23.54 Find no trace of the closing cor. of Tp. 25 S., Rs. 8 and 9 W., after diligent search.

40.07 Fall, 4 lks. S. of the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., on S. bdy. of Sec. 36, which is a Cedar post, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

The true course and distance of this line, is N.89°56' W., 40.07 chs.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky, 3rd rate.

Undergrowth, dense hemlock, little fir and vinemaple.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock and Cedar.

Mountainous land, covered with heavy timber and exceptionally difficult to survey. 40.07 chs.
