

Subdivisions of T. 24 S., R. 9 W., W. M.

CHAINS

The lands along the creeks in Secs. 36, 25, 24 & 13 are first class, covered generally, with a dense growth of vine maple, and other timbers. These lands, when cleared, will be very valuable as agricultural lands. The hills are generally covered with fir and its undergrowths, and they will prove valuable grazing lands, if properly cleared, and grass set.

The timbers, being so remote from channels of transportation are of but little value. Other portions of the township should be subdivided.
