At the cor. of secs. 32 and 33.

Thence I run

N.89*45'E., on a true line on S. bdy, of sec. 33.

Over mountainous land through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.50 Intersect original cor. of secs. 32 and 33 and destroy all references to sec. 4, 5, 32 and 33 on the cor. and bearing trees, but allow cor. to remain as the closing corner to secs. 4 and 5, T. 25 S., R. 9 W., is tied to this corner.

8.25 Branch, 1 lk. wide; course N. and ascend.

13.25 Summit of ridge, sloping N., 150 ft. above branch, and descend 50 ft. to

32.00 A stream, 2 lks. wide; course N. and ascend.

40.00 Set a maple post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 33 on N. face; from which

A fir, 18 ins. dia., bears N.27*E., 8 lks. dis. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 33 B T.

A fir, 16 ins. dia., bears N.40*W., 4 lks. dis. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

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41.57 I destroy all evidence of the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

42.50 Divide or ridge, 150 ft. above stream. Bears N. and S. and descend.

49.50 A brook, 3 lks. wide, 250 ft. below ridge; course N.

71.25 A branch, 1 lk. wide.

80.00 The cor. of secs. 33 and 34, 300 ft. above brook.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, shallow, 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock and cedar.

Undergrowth, rhododendron, vine maple, Oregon grape and huckleberry.

Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth, 80.00 chains.

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
