

Retracement of E. Bdy. of T. 24 S., R. 10 W.

CHAINS

Land, mountainous.  
 Soil 3rd rate.  
 Timber, fir with scattering hemlock and laurel.  
 Undergrowth, rhododendron, salal, huckleberry and  
 Oregon grape.  
 Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with  
 dense undergrowth 78.49 chs.

September 9, 1905

At the cor. of secs. 25 & 36, T.24 S., R.10 W.

Thence I run.

North, on a blank line retracing the E. bdy. of sec. 25  
 T.24 S., R.10 W.

Ascend over mountainous land through heavy timber and dense  
 undergrowth.

1.51 The closing corner of secs. 30 and 31, bears W.1 lk. dis.

9.00 Summit of ridge, 100 ft. above sec. cor., bears NE. and  
 S.20\*W.

Descend 200 ft.

32.75 A stream 2 lks. wide; course NW.

Ascend.

39.55 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. cor. on the East bdy. which is a post  
 firmly set marked and witnessed as described by the  
 Surveyor general, bears West 20 lks. dis.

The true bearing of this line is therefore N.0\*17\*W.

From this  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. cor., I continue to run.

North, on a blank line on East bdy. of sec. 25.

7.45 Top of ascent, 150 ft above stream.

Descend 200 ft.

15.75 A stream, 8 lks. wide; course W.

39.45 The cor. of sec. 24 and 25, heretofore described, bears  
 East 55 lks. dist.

The true bearing of this line is therefore N.0\*48\*E.

Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with  
 dense undergrowth 79.00 chains.
