

Retracement of the East Boundary of T.24 S., R.10 W.

CHAINS

Soil, 3rd rate.

Timber, fir.

Undergrowth, salal, huckleberry and Oregon grape.

September 18, 1905

At the cor. of secs. 24 and 25, T.24 S., R.10 W.

Thence I run

North, on a blank line retracing the East bdy. of sec.24

Over small hills through heavy timber and dense under-
growth.2.31 The C.C. of secs. 19 and 30, T. 24 S., R.9 W., bears E.,
1 lk. dist.39.32 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. which is a fir tree 30 ins. dia., marked
and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General,
bears East, 16 lks. dist.

The true bearing of this line is therefore N.0°14'E.

Thence from the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

I continue to run

North, on a blank line.

39.78 The cor. of secs. 13 & 24, bears East, 42 lks. dist.

The true bearing of this line is therefore N.0°36'E.

Heavy timber prevents taking lat. this day.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, laurel and hemlock.

Undergrowth, salal, huckleberry and rhododendron.

Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with

dense undergrowth 79.10 chs.

September 18, 1905

At the cor. of secs. 13 and 24, T.24 S., R.10 W.

Thence I run

North, on a blank line on the East bdy. of sec. 13.

Descend over mountainous land heavily timbered and covered
with dense undergrowth.
