

## Retracement of the East Boundary of T. 24 S., R. 10 W.

CHAINS

At the cor. of secs. 12 and 13, T. 24 S., R. 10 W.

Thence I run

North, on a blank line retracing the East bdy. of Sec. 12

Through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

5.19 The C. C. of secs. 7 and 8, bears West 9 lks. dist.

10.27 Begin to descend a hillside, facing West 200 ft.

17.77 A stream, 5 lks. wide; course NW.

Ascend 150 ft.

23.27 Top of ascent on mountainside, facing West.

38.27 A point 62 lks. W. of  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., which is a maple post.  
marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor  
General.

The true bearing of this line is therefore N.0°56'W.

From the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.

Thence I run

North on a blank line retracing the East bdy. of sec. 12

Descend 150 ft.

10.00 A stream 2 lks wide; course N.20°E.

12.00 A bend in a stream, 10 lks wide; course N. 10°E.

28.00 A stream, 6 lks. wide; course E.

35.75 A stream, 3 lks. wide; course SE.

39.50 Intersect the cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, heretofore  
described.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 3rd rate.

Timber, fir and hemlock.

Undergrowth, vinemaple, rhododendron, salal and  
huckleberry.

Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with  
dense undergrowth. 77.77 chs.
