

Subdivisions of T. 24 S., R. 9 W.,

CHAINS

Descend over mountainous land through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

- 6.20 A spring, bears N. about 2.50 chains. dis.
- 29.70 A branch, 1 lk. wide; course S.60*W.
- 29.90 A branch, 2 lks. wide, 570 ft. below C. C.; course S.
- 40.09½ Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for ¼ sec. cor. marked ¼ S. 27 on N. face and 34 on S. face, from which
- A fir, 15 ins. dia., bears N.55*W., 14 lks. dis. mkd. ¼ S 27 B. T.
- A fir, 7 ins. dia., bears S.67*W., 20 lks. dis. mkd. ¼ S 34 B T.
- This cor. is at foot of a bare rock hillside, facing S.
- 45.70 A branch, 2 lks. wide, 400 ft. below the C. C.; course S.
- Ascend.
- 66.70 Top of spur, 600 feet above Bear Camp Creek, sloping SW.
- 80.19 The corner of sections 27, 28, 33 and 34.
- Land, mountainous.
- Soil; 3rd rate.
- Timber, fir and hemlock with scattering cedar, chinkapin and yew.
- Undergrowth, vine maple, huckleberry, salal, rhododendron and Oregon grape.
- Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth 81.37 chs. including 1.18 chains connecting line.
