

Subdivision of T. 24 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

Land, mountainous.

Soil; rocky, 4th rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, chinquapin and maple.

Undergrowth, vine maple, rhododendron, salal, Oregon grape and huckleberry.

Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth, 83.59 chs. including 4.67 chs. connecting line.

August 15, 1905

At the cor. of secs. 15, 16, 21 and 22.

Thence I run

N.0°1'W., bet secs. 15 and 16.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense under growth.

4.34 A fir, 36 ins. dia., on line, I mark with 2 notches on N and S sides.

14.00 Descend.

26.50 A branch, 2 lks. wide, 200 ft. below sec. cor; course N.70°E.

Ascend.

32.00 Top of spur, sloping E., 50 ft. above branch and descend.

34.60 Stream, 5 lks. wide, 100 ft. below spur; course S E. and ascend.

40.00 Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 5 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. 16 on W., and 15 on E face; from whichA fir, 24 ins. dia., bears S.27°E., 37 lks. dis. mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 15 B T.A fir, 30 ins. dia., bears N.85°W., 9 lks. dist. mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 16 B T.

52.50 Top of steep ascent on mountainsloping E.

62.50 Cross top of ridge, sloping S.10°W.

Continue ascent on W. side of ridge.
