80.00	Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16, mkd. <p style="margin-left: 40px;">T 24 S. S 10 on NE., R 9 W S 15 on SE., S 16 on SW. and S 9 on NW. face, with 4 notches on S., and 3 notches on E. edge; from which A fir, 40 ins. dia., bears N.42°E., 66 lks. dist. mkd.
