

Subdivision of T. 24 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

Thence I run

S.0\*1'E., on a true line bet. secs. 9 and 10.

Over low hills covered with heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.74 A stream, 4 lks. wide; course W.

9.04 A branch, 1 lk. wide; course N.40\*E.

Begin to ascend mountain.

33.74 Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 9 on W., and 10 on E. face; from which

A fir, 20 ins. dia., bears East,  $31\frac{1}{2}$  lks. dist.  
mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 10 B T.

A fir, 36 ins. dia., bears N.30 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*W., 30 lks. dis.  
mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 9 B T.

This  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. is 300 ft. above C. C.

41.25 Cross a spur, sloping NE.

44.74 Cross an old blazed trail on ridge, bears S.30\*W., and N.45\*E., 200 ft. above  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.

Descend.

59.24 Branch, 1 lk. wide, 100 ft. below ridge; course N.70\*E.

Ascend 150 ft. to

73.74 The cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16.

Land, mountainous.

Soil; 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, laurel, chinquapin and hemlock.

Undergrowth, vine maple, rhododendron, salal and huckleberry.

Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth, 73.74 chs.
