	<p>At the cor. of secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20.</p> <p>Thence I run</p> <p>N.0*2*W., bet. secs. 17 and 18.</p> <p>Descend over mountainous land through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.</p>
1.25	A gulch, 25 ft. deep; course E.
4.25	Enter old slide, largely grown over with brush; northern limit not definite.
	Large timber mostly fallen or dead.
18.00	Branch, 2 lks. wide; course NE.
30.00	A stream, 6 lks. wide, 200 ft. below sec. cor; course east.
	Ascend.
40.00	Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 sq., 24 ins. ins. in ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 18 on W., and 17 on E. face; from which
	A fir, 20 ins. dia., bears N.60*E., 36 lks. dis. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 17 B T.
	A laurel, 14 ins. dia., bears N.48*W., 32 lks. dis. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 18 B T.
	Enter heavy timber at $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
41.50	Cross spur, sloping NE., 450 ft. above stream.
	Descend.
59.20	A stream, 5 lks. wide, 460 ft. below top of spur; course N.70*E., and ascend.
71.50	Cross a spur, sloping NE., 300 ft. above stream.
79.30	Branch, 2 lks. wide, 180 ft. below spur; course E.
