A Hemlock, 8 in. dia., bears S.85°E., 19 lks. dist.,  
marked T 25 S R 1 W S 30 B T.,  
A Cedar, 18 in. dia., bears N.84°W., 16 lks. dist.,  
marked T 25 S R 2 W S 24 B T.,  
A Hemlock, 12 in. dia., bears N.35°E., 12 lks. dist.,  
marked T 25 S R 1 W S 19 B T.,  
A Hemlock, 24 in. dia., bears S.74°W., 35 lks. dist.,  
marked T 25 S R 2 W S 25 B T.

Land mountainous.

Soil 3rd rate.

Densely covered with forests of fir, pine, cedar,  
hemlock, yew, laurel, maple, alder, chinquapin and  
dogwood.

Thick undergrowth of sallal, vinemaple, hazel,  
manzanita, fir, laurel, salmonberry and huckleberry.
