A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.33°E., 52 lks. dist. marked T 25 S R 1 E S 30 B T.

A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.18°W., 109 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 1 W S 25 B T.

A Fir, 48 ins. diam., bears N.18°W., 36 lks. dist. marked T 25 S R 1 W S 24 B T.

This cor. is on a hillside, sloping S.

Land mountainous.

Soil, 3rd rate and 4th rate, rocky.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, madrona, chinquapin, and dogwood.

Dense undergrowth of rhododendron, vinemaple, hazel, hemlock, fir, chinquapin and sallal-berry.

Land mountainous and covered with dense undergrowth, 80.00 chs.
