A chinquapin, 5 ins. diam., bears N.52°E., 41 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 32 B T.

No other tree in limits, and raised a mound of stone, 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, W of cor.

Pits impracticable.

Leave timber, bears E and W., enter burn.
