West on S bdy., sec. 33, T 25 S R 1 W.

Over mountainous land, heavily timbered and covered
with dense undergrowth.

Ascend along NE slope.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., which is a basalt stone, 5x12x10 ins.
above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as
described by the surveyor general, bears S 44 lks.
dist.I re-establish this cor. in its original position as
the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on S bdy., sec. 33, T 25 S R 1 W,
only, as follows:

dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 33 B T.A Dogwood, 5 ins. diam., bears N.20*W., 27 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 33 B T.I obliterate marks on former bearing tree referring to
sec. 4.The course of this line is S.89*23'W., and the dist.
is 40.76 chs.From the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. I run

West on S bdy., sec. 33, T 25 S R 1 W.

Ascend E. slope.

40.00 chs.
