Land mountainous. Soil 3rd rate. Densely covered with forest of pine, fir, cedar, hemlock, yew & Chinquapin. A thick undergrowth of hazel, vine maple, salmonberry and huckleberry.

General Description.

This Township is high rough & mountainous. Densely covered with forests & thick undergrowth. Timber of fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, laurel, chinquapin, yew & dogwood. Thick undergrowth of sallow, fir, vine maple, hazel, salmonberry, manzanita, laurel huckleberry, thimbleberry and mountain balm.
