Subdivisional and Exterior Lines of T. 23²⁰ S., R. 2 W., W. M.

CHAINS

I set a basalt stone 16 x 11 x 8 ins., 11 ins. in the ground for closing cor. of secs. 35 and 36 marked C C with 1 notch on E and 5 notches on W edges, from which,
 A maple, 4 ins. diam., bears N.18*E.; 47 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 2 W S 36 B T.
 A hemlock, 6 ins. diam., bears N.72*W., 65 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 2 W S 35 B T.

Thence I run,

N. 1*W. on a true line between secs. 35 and 36.

Over mountainous land, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

Along steep rocky mountain side sloping west.

7.81 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, flows W.

25.00 Descend 80 ft. to

30.10 Spring branch 3 lks. wide, flows SW and ascend 160 ft. to

38.00 Spur slopes SW and descend.

38.51 Set basalt stone 16 x 8 x 7 ins., 11 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. between secs. 35 and 36 marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W faces, from which,

A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears S.81*E., 45 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 B T.

A hemlock, 4 ins. diam., bears N.24*W., 23 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 35 B T.

51.56 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, flows SW about 100 ft. below spur and ascend 250 ft. to

78.51 The cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36.

Land mountainous. Soil rocky 3rd rate. Timber fir, pine, and hemlock. Undergrowth maple, willow, rhododendron, arbutus and spicewood. Mountainous land or land covered with heavy timber or dense undergrowth. 78.51 chs.

N. 1' W., between secs. 25 and 26.

Over mountainous land, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.
